

ABOUT MY HEARING

When I wear my cochlear implant processors, I can hear a lot! That is how I have learnt to speak. Sometimes it is harder for me to hear when I am a long way from the speaker or when there is lots of noise in the background. In the classroom, I use an FM system which helps me to hear the teacher's voice better.

MY TOOLBOX



Cochlear implants: these are the parts inside my head, you can't see those!

Audio Processors: this is the technology you see on my ears and head.

FM System: my teacher wears a microphone and the receiver connects to my audio processors.
